


Driver services recovery update


Car driving test recovery report

There is currently 12.91% (80k) of all car test slots available for booking. This has increased from a low of 3.34% (15k) in June 21

The number of driving test centres (DTCs) experiencing little or no availability and reporting a waiting time of 24 weeks has reduced to 75 DTCs from a high of 97 at the end of May 22







Recovery update cont.

Since April 2021, the DVSA has created 695,000 extra car practical driving tests appointments, to help reduce waiting times, by:

Measure introduced	Number of car practical driving slots created
Recruiting new driving examiners	300,000
Conducting out of normal hours testing through overtime, including at weekends and on public holidays	190,000
Asking colleagues who are qualified to carry out driving tests, but do not do so as part of their normal duties, to do so	120,000
Converting any unsold motorcycle tests and vocational tests to car tests 7 days before the test appointment	58,000
Buying back annual leave from driving examiners	20,000
Inviting recently retired driving examiners to return to work	7,000

The campaign's impact so far

- 72.5% of ADIs are aware of the 'Ready to Pass?' campaign
- 45% of ADIs who are aware of the campaign have shared its resources with their pupils when they're close to taking their test, 28% shared them with all their pupils
- 85% of ADIs who have used the campaign resources said they are useful
- 49.5% of ADIs who used our new mock test guidance said it helped them to encourage their pupils who were not ready to postpone their test
